Living Traditions: Folk Art and Beyond Guidelines

Application Deadline: Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis until June 30, 2026, or until all available funds have been awarded. Applications must be submitted at least 45 days prior to the start of the proposed project.

Program Overview

The **Living Traditions: Folk Art and Beyond Grant** celebrates and invests in the cultural practices and creative expressions that connect communities across the Creative West region.

Living traditions are cultural practices rooted in community life—passed down through generations, adapted over time, and continually reimagined to meet the needs of the present. They encompass—but are not limited to—folk and traditional arts, craft, music, dance, foodways, oral traditions, storytelling, spiritual practices, and the everyday creative expressions that embody identity, belonging, and resilience.

As the National Endowment for the Arts defines, folk and traditional arts are "rooted in and reflective of the cultural life of a community," expressed by groups who share a common heritage, geography, language, religion, occupation, or way of life. The American Folklore Society describes folklore and folklife as the expressive culture shared within social groups, encompassing both artistic and functional forms.

The "beyond" signals the expansive and evolving nature of these practices: new forms and expressions that emerge in rural towns, Indigenous homelands, island communities, immigrant neighborhoods, and urban centers alike. Living traditions are dynamic—they adapt, evolve, and carry forward artistry, wisdom, and cultural knowledge that sustain and inspire communities.

This grant program supports projects that honor, share, and transmit these traditions in ways that strengthen community bonds, foster intergenerational connection, and expand access to cultural expression.

Period of Performance: Projects and activities may occur January 12, 2026 - August 31, 2026

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- Be a tax-exempt 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, a federally recognized tribal government, or a unit of state or local government.
- Be incorporated and actively conducting business in one or more of the following states or jurisdictions: Alaska, American Samoa, Arizona, California, Colorado, Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI), Guam, Hawai'i, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington, Wyoming.
- Provide a valid Employer Identification Number (EIN).
- Provide a valid UEI from SAM.gov
- Must not be suspended, proposed for debarment, or debarred by the U.S. Government (2 CFR 200.318(h))
- Be in good standing with Creative West, with no overdue reports or documentation.

Collaborative projects are encouraged; one organization must apply as the lead applicant and assume financial and reporting responsibility.

Created in 1993 to further FCA's mission to encourage, sponsor, and promote work of a contemporary, experimental nature, Emergency Grants provide urgent funding for visual and performing artists and poets who:

- Have sudden, unanticipated opportunities to present their work to the public when there is insufficient time to seek other sources of funding
- Incur unexpected or unbudgeted expenses for projects close to completion with committed exhibition or performance dates

Emergency Grants is a year-round, multi-disciplinary program that offers immediate, project-based assistance to artists living and working anywhere in the United States, for projects occurring in the U.S. and abroad.

Each month FCA receives an average of 100 Emergency Grant applications and makes approximately 15-20 grants in the range of \$500 to \$3,000 each. Applicants may request any amount in that range and, if granted, may receive full or partial funding. The average grant is currently \$1,900.
